The Difference Between Spam and Phishing?

Whilst spam and phishing can be confused as the same thing, due to they both being inbox-clogging nuisances, there are a few key differences. Knowing the difference between the two can help you take proper action.

One of them (phishing) is actively aiming to steal login credentials and other sensitve data. However, spam tries to capture business by sending unsolicited emails to bulk lists. Although annoying, spam is not as dangerous as phishing which tricks the user into giving over sensitive information.

Spam in a snapshot

Spam is junkmail, and been around for as long as the internet. It tries to sell to a larger market of buyers for those items that the buyers may have had an interest in, by obtaining email addresses, sending off in bulk messages of goods and services, hundreds of thousands of times. Common types can be chain mail, coupons, adult content and unwanted newsletters as an example.

Phishing in a snapshot

Phishing is created by a malignant actor to harm a company or individual by obtaining sensitive information. It takes on what may seem as a legitimate message from a reputable sender. Usually associated with identity theft, emails target banking credentials, passwords, cash advances and other information of value.

- 15. The offer seems too good to be true.
- 16. You didn't initiate the action.
- 17. You're asked to send money to cover expenses.
- 18. The message makes unrealistic threats.
- 19. The message appears to be from a government agency.
- 20. Something just doesn't look right.
